### **Policies**

#### **Current National Policy FAR 19.201(a)**

"It is the policy of the Government to provide <u>maximum practicable opportunities</u> in its acquisitions to small business, veteran-owned small business, servicedisabled veteran-owned small business, HUBZone small business, small disadvantaged business, and women-owned small business concerns. Such concerns have the maximum practicable opportunity to participate as subcontractors in the contracts awarded by any executive agency, consistent with efficient contract performance. The Small Business Administration (SBA) counsels and assists contracting personnel to ensure that a fair proportion of contracts for supplies and services is placed with small business."

#### **NNSA Policy**

"... To meet the Secretary's and NNSA's small business contracting objectives, ... we will reserve for small business all new NNSA non-management and operating (M&O) contract requirements, as well as all expiring NNSA non-M&O contracts where the requirement continues."

### **Focus Areas**

- Reduce Nuclear Dangers by securing all vulnerable nuclear materials worldwide within four years and strengthening the nonproliferation regime;
- Manage the Nuclear Weapons Stockpile by completing life extension programs and through robust surveillance and assessment activities, both enabled by investments in the science, technology, and engineering base;
- Advance Naval Nuclear Propulsion by developing the next generation reactor plant for the Ohio-class submarine, and replacing and refueling the land-based prototype;
- Modernize the NNSA Infrastructure to ensure that the core capabilities are in place to meet mission requirements for the long-term and to create a 21st century Nuclear Security Enterprise;
- Strengthen the Science, Technology and Engineering Base that underpin current mission needs and to deal with broader national security challenges for the country; and
- Drive an Integrated and Effective Enterprise through the application of improved governance and business models and the recruitment and retention of highly talented Federal nuclear security professionals.



### **Major Accomplishments**

- NNSA received the 2010 Distinguished Project Award from the Project Management Institute for developing a state-of-the-art project management information system to manage the Global Threat Reduction Initiative. This is the first time this award has been given to a Federal agency;
- The Kansas City Plant's management and operating contractor, Honeywell FM&T, received the Malcom Baldridge National Quality Award for efforts to improve quality and productivity;
- Through its Supply Chain Management Center which uses technology to improve procurement of common items, NNSA saved \$213 million since its inception in 2007;
- Completed a large scale campaign to provide secure long-term storage for more than 10 metric tons of highly enriched uranium and three metric tons of weapons-grade plutonium in Kazakhstan enough to make 775 nuclear weapons;
- Completed installation of radiation detection equipment at 64 targeted land border crossings, airports and seaports around the world for a total of 399 installations completed;
- Played an instrumental role in negotiating and securing ratification of the new START treaty and led the international effort to revise IAEA/INFCIRC/225, "The Physical Protection of Nuclear Materials and Nuclear Facilities," first major Nuclear Security Summit deliverable completed.
