Unlocking Home Energy Upgrade Investments

Residential Network members the Rocky Mountain Institute and Building Performance Institute released a new report, Peer Diffusion: A Promising Way for Service Providers to Unlock Investments in Home Energy Upgrades. The report outlines a "peer diffusion" strategy for contractors to promote social interaction and social comparison among homeowners around home improvements. It shows that by using online and in-



person tactics to enable peer diffusion before, during, and after projects, contractors can help make energy upgrades a "must have" for homeowners. This will also encourage increased investments in energy upgrades, since research shows half of homeowners report families and friends influenced their previous home-buying decisions.
