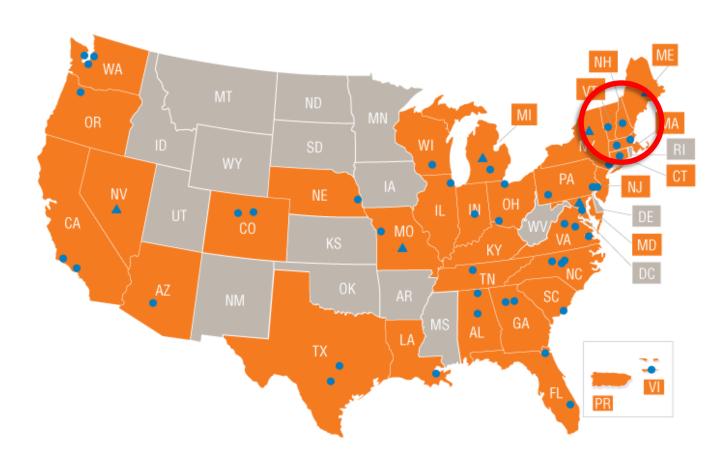

## New Hampshire Program



#### Developing a 2-day low-tech course about building science

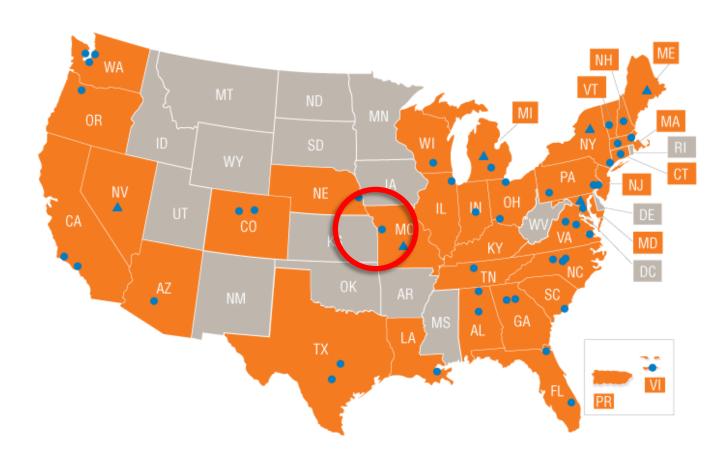
- Targeted at veterans and the unemployed
- Goal is to demystify home performance and operation
- First day focuses on definitions, basic concepts, and how to read equipment, ratings, and labels
- Second day is field building assessment and time for discussing participants' questions and personal experiences
- Course includes one hour focused on how the real estate community can learn to communicate the value of efficient buildings
- Graduation networking offered at end of course

#### Also offers BPI Certification

- Training provided in partnership with community colleges, NH Office of Energy Planning and Berlin Better Buildings
- Gives underserved communities in northern part of state access to training
- NH program offers training subsidies and scholarships

# **Kansas City**

## Kansas City Program



- Kansas City's Metropolitan Energy Center offers training courses in residential and commercial energy auditing, healthy homes, and deconstruction
- Developed a written test that mimics the national certifying exam to highlight weaknesses and improve courses
- Instituted a mentored practicum experience that follows the trainings
  - Each candidate must complete a full complement of diagnostics 1:1 with an instructor in a dummy house
- Quality assurance provided as part of the local utility home performance energy star rebate program
  - Instructor accompanies an auditor on their first three jobs
- Mentoring also occurs once contractors are in the network
  - Currently developing a merit-based point system for seasoned contractors who agree to mentor newer contractors

### Lessons Learned



- Integrate training and mentorship with other programs and goals
  - Several programs coordinate with community colleges to provide trainings
  - City of Milwaukee developing contractor "boot camp" for hands-on training in empty foreclosed homes, and conducts assessment trainings in renteroccupied foreclosures
  - Cincinnati is exploring partnerships with Habitat for Humanity to provide veterans assistance through energy audits and home performance improvements
  - Weatherization contractors are prime candidates for home performance and remediation work (including deconstruction); several weatherization training labs are set up nationally
- Mentoring on the first few jobs allows for tailored feedback based on each contractors strengths and weaknesses

### Lessons Learned, Cont.



- Consider a diverse approach that includes remediation and deconstruction
  - How materials are reintroduced to the market stream is one way to address a building's embodied energy
  - Building science experts are great at taking a building apart
- Support customer relations skills
  - Contractors have identified this as an area of interest
  - Program approaches include: sales training; a standardized audit template that allows the program to support customers and provides a tool that both contractors and auditors recognize; quick rebates turnaround requirement as part of the contractor agreement
