#### Minutes

#### I. Call to Order

The Bi-monthly meeting of the Northern New Mexico Citizens' Advisory Board (NNMCAB) Waste Management (WM) and Environmental Monitoring & Remediation (EM&R) Committees was held on April 27, 2016 at the NNMCAB Office in Pojoaque, New Mexico.

Mr. Lee Bishop, Co-Deputy Designated Federal Officer stated that on behalf of the Department of Energy (DOE) the meeting of the NNMCAB was called to order at 1:05 p.m. Mr. Bishop recognized Ms. Angelica Gurulé, WM Committee Chair, Ms. Gurulé presided at the meeting.

The meeting of the NNMCAB was open to the public and posted in The Federal Register in accordance with the Federal Advisory Committee Act.

#### II. Establishment of a Quorum (11 Needed)

#### a. Roll Call

Mr. William Alexander conducted roll call as the members arrived. At the call to order 10 members were present. Mr. Alexander recorded that at the call to order, a quorum was not present.

#### b. Excused Absences

Mr. Alexander recorded that the following members had an excused absence: Ms. Angel Quintana, Dr. Nona Girardi, Mr. Danny Mayfield, Mr. Max Baca, and Ms. Tessa Jo Mascareñas.

#### c. Absences

Mr. Alexander recorded that the following members were absent: Mr. Michael Valerio, Ms. Irene Tse-Pe, Mr. Alex Puglisi, Mr. Michael Whiting, and Mr. Rod Sanchez.

#### III. Approval of Agenda

The Combined Committee (CC) reviewed the Agenda for the April 27, 2016 meeting. Ms. Gurulé asked for a motion.

Ms. Varela made a motion to approve the agenda; Mr. Sayre seconded the motion. The motion to approve the agenda passed.

#### IV. Approval of Minutes

Ms. Gurulé opened the floor for questions or comments on the minutes from the March 9, 2016 CC meeting.

Mr. Sayre made a motion to approve the minutes as presented; Mr. Tiano seconded the motion. The members voted all in favor, the motion to approve the minutes as presented passed.

#### V. Introductions

Ms. Gurulé asked for introductions from the board members and all attending guests.

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#### VI. Old Business

Ms. Gurulé opened the floor for discussion on Old Business.

Mr. Sayre stated that he and Ms. Sanderson had attended the Spring 2016 Chairs meeting at the Oak Ridge Site. He noted that the tour of the site had been very beneficial. He stated that the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant (WIPP) had been a topic of discussion at the meeting. Additionally, noting that WIPP is still scheduled for a slow start in December of 2016. Mr. Sayre advised the members that the Chairs had drafted two recommendations that would be on the NNMCABs May board meeting agenda for consideration and action.

Mr. Schmelling asked if WIPP had lost any of its capacity due to the incident in February 2014.

Mr. Bishop responded that the first room in panel 7 had been lost, as it had to be sealed due to the incident and it was only about half full. Additionally, he noted that the remote handled waste is no longer going to be stored in room walls due to problems associated with drilling into the potentially contaminated salt in the wall. He noted that there are plans to possibly stack the remote handled waste on the floor and cover it in salt, this change would also remove some of the capacity at the site. Mr. Bishop stated that he would guess approximately 5% of the waste capacity may have been lost due to the incident.

#### VII. New Business

# Discussion on Draft Recommendation 2016-03 "Consent Order Revision" Ms. Gurulé asked Mr. Valdez if he would like to give a brief overview of Draft

Recommendation 2016-03.

Mr. Valdez responded that the purpose of the draft recommendation was to provide comments to the New Mexico Environment Department on the revision to the LANL Order on Consent. Additionally, noting that the overall intent of the recommendation was to help improve the quality and clarity of the Consent Order

Ms. Gurulé opened the floor for discussion on the draft recommendation.

After lengthy discussion the NNMCAB members decided to incorporate the following changes to the recommendation:

1. Move the comment section lines 27 through 36 to the top of the recommendations section.

2. On line 27 remove appreciates and replace with agrees and recommends.

 3. Add additional recommendations to the recommendation section as numbers 7 and 8.

4. Incorporate comments provided by Mr. Schmelling into the recommendation.

and improve the effectiveness of remediation at LANL.

 Ms. Gurulé stated that the Ad-Hoc committee would take the action of incorporating the changes to the recommendation. Additionally, noting that if the members had additional changes for incorporation, they should submit them to the Ad-Hoc committee no later than May 3, 2016. Ms. Gurulé advised the members that Draft Recommendation 2016-03 would be on the May 18, 2016 agenda for consideration and action.

#### b. LANL Consent Order Comments

Ms. Gurulé noted that in the packet today were comments that Mr. Schmelling provided on the LANL Compliance Order on Consent.

Mr. Schmelling noted that he had provided four comments on the new Consent Order that he thought needed to be addressed in order for the new Consent Order to be effective. These comments have been incorporated into his comments on Draft Recommendation 2016-03.

The comments provided by Mr. Schmelling are provided as an attachment to the minutes.

#### VIII. Update from DDFO

Mr. Bishop stated that the new EM office would be moving to Pueblo Complex in May. He noted that the Chromium Project was going well and that operations for the interim action were moving forward. Mr. Bishop stated that the new filter assemblies were in the process of being installed on all of the Remediated Nitrate Salt Drums. Additionally, noting that the process should be completed before the next NNMCAB Board Meeting.

Mr. Bishop noted that the next Chairs Meeting is in Las Vegas Nevada the last week of August 2016. He also noted that the week of September 7<sup>th</sup> the Rad Waste Summit is being held in Nevada, if any members would like to attend please let the Executive Committee know.

Mr. Gardipe stated that DOE is working on the Life Cycle Baseline and that as soon as it is available, DOE will be happy to provide a briefing to the NNMCAB.

#### IX. Presentation

## a. Department of Energy Buckman Direct Diversion

Ms. Cheryl Rodriguez, Department of Energy, Environmental Management Los Alamos, and Mr. Steve Veenis Los Alamos National Security gave a presentation entitled, "Memorandums of Understanding Between the Department of Energy and the Buckman Direct Diversion Board Regarding Water Quality Monitoring and Surface Water Protection." 2		Ms. Gurulé asked what the results of the fate analysis were.
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4		Ms. Rodriguez responded that the regulatory compliance officer for Buckman had just
5		finalized the results of the study. Ms. Rodriguez noted that she thought that the report
6		should be available on Buckman's website.
7		
8		Mr. Sayre asked if the new cameras were picking up flow where E 109.9 used to be
9		located.
10		
11		Ms. Rodriguez responded that, "the location where E109.9 was, is where the first
12		camera has been installed."
13		
14		Ms. Gurulé asked how the automated samplers work.
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16		Ms. Rodriguez responded that once flow is detected by the sampler it sends an
17		automated signal to Buckman notifying them that there is flow at the sampling location
18		Additionally, she noted that at the same time the automated sampler begins collecting
19		water.
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21		Mr. Sayre asked when the next Buckman meeting would be conducted.
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23		Ms. Rodriguez noted that the next meeting would be in November.
24		
25		Ms. Gurulé asked about the sampling of PCB's from the weir sediments and if LANL
26		had found any in the samples collected.
27		
28		Mr. Veenis responded that yes LANL sampled for PCB's; however, the levels detected
29		in the LA Weir sediments were below the regulatory levels, so the removed sediments
30		were not classified as hazardous waste.
31		
32		Mr. Sayre asked what the COR logs are made from.
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34		Mr. Veenis responded that COR logs rolls from 20 to 30 feet long are made from
35		coconut fiber which doesn't degrade as quickly as wood chips or straw.
36		
37		Mr. Sayre asked if LANL monitors the Rio Grande.
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39		Mr. Veenis responded that the Rio is monitored annually from the Otowi Bridge to
40		Cochiti, with the samples being collected during the annual raft trip.
41		
42		Ms. Gurulé asked how the PCB's got into Los Alamos Canyon.

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2		Mr. Veenis responded that in the early days of the lab there were multiple facilities on
3		the canyon rim and that is where the PCB's likely came from.
4		
5		Mr. Schmelling asked how often the Buckman Direct Diversion shuts down due to high
6		turbidity in the river.
7 8		Mr. Veenis responded that it happens quite often and is usually due to sediments
9		washing out of Guaje Canyon, due to the impact of the Las Conchas fire on that area.
