SUBJECT: Continuing Appropriations Act, 2014 -- Implementation of Division F, Title I, Title II, and Title III, and Division G, Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act, 2013, Pub. L. No. 113-6

SUMMARY: Section 101(a)(6) of the Continuing Appropriations Act, 2014, Pub. L. No. 113-46, makes appropriations available through January 15, 2014 for continuing projects or activities that were conducted under Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act, 2013, Pub. L. No. 113-6, under the same authority and conditions. Section 104 provides that no appropriation under the continuing resolution shall be used to initiate or resume any project or activity for which appropriations, funds, or other authority were not available during fiscal year 2013. Therefore, the Acquisition Letter (AL) 2013-06 and Financial Assistance Letter (FAL) 2013-04 providing implementing instructions and guidance for Division F, Title I, Title II, and Title III, and Division G, Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act, 2013, Pub. L. No. 113-6 remains in effect until rescinded or superseded.

This means that the 301(b) Congressional Notifications of Multi-year Awards reporting for certain contract awards, as identified in AL 2013-06, and all multi-year grant and cooperative agreement

awards using funds appropriated by the Act for a program, project or activity under the “Department of Energy-Energy Programs, as identified in FAL 2013-04, will continue.
