Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Order 451.1A), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. (See also B3.1 of appendix B to this subpart.)

B3.6 Small-scale research and development, laboratory operations, and pilot projects

Siting, construction, modification, operation, and decommissioning of facilities for smallscale research and development projects; conventional laboratory operations (such as preparation of chemical standards and sample analysis); and smallscale pilot projects (generally less than 2 years) frequently conducted to verify a concept before demonstration actions, provided that construction or modification would be within or contiguous to a previously disturbed or developed area (where active utilities and currently used roads are readily accessible). Not included in this category are demonstration actions, meaning actions that are undertaken at a scale to show whether a technology would be viable on a larger scale and suitable for commercial deployment.

## Rational for determination:

DOE is proposing to provide federal funding to Carlisle Construction Materials Incorporated to conduct laboratory research and development activities that advance solar photovoltaic (PV) technology.

The proposed project would be conducted in three phases. This NEPA determination applies only to Phase 1: design, fabrication and testing of prototype modules. Installation and demonstration of the prototype will require additional NEPA review. Phases 2 and 3 are subject to additional NEPA review.

Phase 1 activities will be completed at an existing laboratory. The facility has completed an R&D questionnaire addressing the protocols in place for laboratory safety, risk management, chemical handling and waste disposal. All hazardous waste generated in the R&D Lab is lab-packed in containers by trained personal and the waste drums are disposed of through a RCRA-approved treatment, storage, and disposal facility. The lab follows the requirements outlined in 29CFR §1910.1450 'Occupational Exposures to Hazardous Chemicals in Laboratories' and is outfitted with personal protective equipment (safety glasses, goggles, respirators, gloves, lab coats, hearing protection, face shields); fire extinguishers and fire alarms; safety showers; eye wash stations; first aid kits and an AED; spill cleanup kits; fume hoods and local exhausts; and various gas monitors and alarms.

Based on this information, DOE has determined the work outlined is consistent with activities identified in categorical exclusion A9 (information gathering) and B3.6 (indoor bench-scale research and conventional laboratory operation).
