Proposed Action Title: (0470-1507) University of Massachusetts-Amherst - Development of a Dedicated, High-Value Biofuels Crop

Program or Field Office: Advanced Research Projects Agency - Energy

Location(s) (City/County/State): Amherst, MA; Cambridge, MA; Pullman, WA; Berkeley, CA

Proposed Action Description:

Funding will support development of genetically modified (GM) camelina that grows faster and produces more seed oil than natural camelina and that produces the high-value biofuel product limonene in both the seeds and leaves of the plant.

Proposed work will consist of (1) laboratory-based genetic modification of cyanobacteria and other microorganisms, nicotiana, and camelina; (2) growth of GM nicotiana and GM camelina in contained growth chambers and greenhouses; and (3) laboratory-based analysis of the resulting GM nicotiana and GM camelina plants using standard techniques to determine if they meet target milestones. This project will not involve field tests of GM plants.

Proposed genetic modification of microorganisms will take place at the University of California - Berkeley campus in Berkeley, CA. Proposed genetic engineering and growth of GM nicotiana and GM camelina will take place at the University of Massachusetts - Amherst campus in Amherst, MA, the Washington State University campus in Pullman, WA, and the Metabolix, Inc. facility in Cambridge, MA. Standard laboratory analyses of GM nicotiana and GM camelina will be performed at the University of Massachusetts - Amherst campus in Amherst, MA. All university teams will receive approval from their respective Institutional Biosafety Committees prior to beginning work with recombinant DNA molecules.

There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposal has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.
