




NNSA KEY POINTS

- Semi-Autonomous Organization

- FY 2016 Est. Procurement Base: Over \$11.5B
- Management & Operating Contractors (M&O's) fulfill mission work (FY 2015: ~90% of funding)
- Majority of small business opportunities are with our M&O contractors (FY 2015: Over \$1.7 B)
- FY 2015 Federal Small Business Obligations: Over \$223M!



FY 2016 Budget Request - \$12.6B








FY 2017 Budget Request = \$12.9B
