



What are the S.A.P. and S.A.T.?



13.002 Purpose.

The purpose of this part is to prescribe simplified acquisition procedures in order to—

(a) Reduce administrative costs;

(b) Improve opportunities for small, small disadvantaged, women-owned, veteran-owned, HUBZone, and servicedisabled veteran-owned small business concerns to obtain a fair proportion of Government contracts;

(c) Promote efficiency and economy in contracting; and

(d) Avoid unnecessary burdens for agencies and contractors

The FAR states "Each acquisition of **supplies or services** that has an anticipated dollar value exceeding **\$3,500** and not exceeding **\$150,000** is <u>reserved exclusively for small</u> business concerns and shall be set aside."

The **Micropurchase Threshold** was increased to \$3500 on October 1, 2015.

Rule of Two

In summary the rule states: 'Each acquisition of supplies or services that has an anticipated dollar value exceeding \$3,000 but not over \$150,000, is automatically reserved exclusively for small business concerns and shall be set aside for small business unless the contracting officer determines **there is not** a reasonable expectation of obtaining offers from two or more responsible small business concerns that are competitive in terms of market prices, quality, and delivery.'



RFQ vs RFP

Solicitations under Simplified Acquisition Procedures are called Request for Quotations (RFQ).

Solicitations under competitive or negotiated procedures are called Requests for Proposals (RFP).

Combined

Synopsis/Solicitation

Evaluation of Quotations or Offers a/k/a FAR 13.106-2

(1) The contracting officer has broad discretion in fashioning suitable evaluation procedures. The procedures prescribed in <u>Parts 14</u> and <u>15</u> are not mandatory. At the contracting officer's discretion, one or more, but not necessarily all, of the evaluation procedures in <u>Part 14</u> or <u>15</u> may be used.

Evaluation of other factors, such as past performance(i) Does not require the creation or existence of a formal data base; and
(ii) May be based on one or more of the following:
(A) The contracting officer's knowledge of and previous experience with the supply or service being acquired;

Awards and IDVs

An 'Indefinite Delivery Vehicle' is a contract/agreement awarded to one or more vendors to facilitate the delivery of supply and service orders. These are the only award instruments which may have orders placed against them.

An '**Award**' is a contractual vehicle (vice an agreement) that <u>cannot have orders placed against it</u> (the only way to change an 'award' is to modify it). Awards are made to a single vendor.
