Re: Ex Parte Communication following meeting between DOE and the National Marine Manufacturers Association

At 2 p.m. ET on Wednesday, May 7 2014 the National Marine Manufacturers Association (NMMA) along with representatives from three of its member organizations met with Jeremy Dommu of the Department of Energy's Office of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy.
