


- The Menominee Nation once occupied 9.5 million acres of land
- The present Menominee Reservation was established in 1854 with 234,000 acres.
- The Menominee hunted, fished and harvested wild rice on their reservation.






• The Menominee retained their island of timber & community by dint of their own tenacity, federal protection and fortuitous circumstance.





 95% of the reservation produces the finest old stands of hardwood, pine and hemlock located in the Great Lakes region.






• Forty-six of Wisconsin's timber varieties grow and are harvested on the reservation.






- 24 miles of the Wolf River flows through the Menominee Reservation.
- It is one of the last pristine rivers in the state.





- Located along the river at Keshena Falls is the Menominee Logging Camp Museum
- Visitors view over 20,000 artifacts housed in 7 log buildings

• MTE is the business arm of the Menominee Indian Tribe of Wisconsin




### Menominee Tribal Enterprises

- Employs ~300 individuals throughout its operation. The mill alone employs ~160 in peak season.

### Current District Heating System Site



### Project Scope



- Demo and Replace a 25,000 PPH boiler with a 8,600 PPH high pressure steam boiler
- Automate and update an existing boiler to operate for peaking and backup
- Generate 1,000 MWh with backpressure steam turbine
- New Fuel handling, storage and processing system
- Tie additional load to the steam plant

### **Timeline**

- September 2012 March 2013 : Feasibility study by USFS WBUG Technical Assistance Team
- May 2013 September 2013 : applied for grants and financing
- October 2013 : Automation of Boiler 1 started with USFS-WBUG grant

- November 2013 March 2014 : financing commitments secured
- **March 2014** : project engineering started
- **May 2014** : Piney Creek fuel processing equipment transaction
- **July 2014** : contracts signed for boiler, fuel handling and storage system and turbine
