Project Title: Routine Site Inspections, Monitoring, and Maintenance at L-Bar, New Mexico, Disposal Site

Location: L-Bar, Cibola County, New Mexico

Proposed Action or Project Description:

LM proposes to perform routine inspections, maintenance, and monitoring activities at the site. The activities would be performed as needed, within the limitations, conditions, and exclusions identified in the Categorical Exclusion Evaluation for activities under this proposed action.

Inspections, site visits, and site tours would be performed to noninvasively inspect the site and its features and assets for informational gathering or sharing purposes. At a minimum, the site would be inspected on an annual basis. Non-ground-intrusive tasks, such as visual monitoring and measuring features, could occur as part of these activities.

Routine maintenance activities could include: replacing/repairing damaged perimeter signs, site markers, survey/boundary monuments, or aerial survey quality control monuments; performing vegetation management including vegetation trimming, mowing, reseeding, weed removal, and herbicide applications for weed control; maintaining and repairing existing fencing, including the placement of fence posts along existing fence lines; and removing sand built up along fencing. Work could include modifying existing fence lines by installing several gates; maintaining groundwater monitoring wells, including performing well development activities and pump repairs; performing minor road or parking area repairs; placing or removing t-posts, survey markers, flagging pins, etc.; maintenance, calibration, replacement, and removal of System Operation and Analysis at Remote Sites (SOARS) monitoring equipment; installing, moving, and maintaining motion-activated, battery-operated, t-post-mounted wildlife trail cameras on the disposal cell; replacing locks; trash removal; and onsite driving of vehicles, all-terrain vehicles, and utility vehicles to support field activities.

Monitoring activities would include performing the following: routine groundwater monitoring and sampling at onsite and offsite wells within the monitoring network; vegetation, wildlife, rock, and erosion monitoring through visual observations; and other non-ground-intrusive monitoring to obtain information supporting future site projects or scientific studies (i.e., performing a geophysical investigation/electromagnetic survey on the cell cover).

There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.
