Proposed Action or Project Description:

LM would implement a supplemental sampling and materials testing event for the disposal cell cover system at the Mexican Hat, Utah, Uranium Mill Tailings Radiation Control Act (UMTRCA) Title I Disposal Site (site). This supplemental sampling and testing event is intended to reduce uncertainties and yield additional data on subsurface material characteristics to improve understanding of the lateral and vertical extent of internal erosion features within the cover system, improve confidence in the current conceptual site model (also called a CSM) with respect to internal erosion process operating at the site, and provide data to support numerical modeling and future selection of a preferred remedy design. The approach for additional investigations specifically includes the supplemental materials sampling and testing of cover components on the disposal cell side slopes and the original borrow material area, geotechnical and chemical analyses, and the installation of a SOARS camera station to monitor flow downgradient of the toe apron. Data obtained through this work would be used to further confirm possible causes for the cover degradation features that have been observed at the site and to determine long-term performance implications on the east, northeast, north, and west side slopes of the disposal cell. This work plan includes potential test pit locations and offsite source materials to be sampled, with adjustments to be made in the field based on onsite observations. In addition to describing sampling of cell cover components and the original borrow materials, this plan also describes how additional gamma radiological surveys will be performed utilizing a handheld sodium iodide scintillometer during test pit excavations and sampling activities.
