#### Description: B5.1

(a) Actions to conserve energy or water, demonstrate potential energy or water conservation, and promote energy Actions to efficiency that would not have the potential to cause significant changes in the indoor or outdoor concentrations of conserve potentially harmful substances. These actions may involve financial and technical assistance to individuals (such energy or as builders, owners, consultants, manufacturers, and designers), organizations (such as utilities), and water governments (such as state, local, and tribal). Covered actions include, but are not limited to weatherization (such as insulation and replacing windows and doors); programmed lowering of thermostat settings; placement of timers on hot water heaters; installation or replacement of energy efficient lighting, low-flow plumbing fixtures (such as faucets, toilets, and showerheads), heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems, and appliances; installation of drip-irrigation systems; improvements in generator efficiency and appliance efficiency ratings; efficiency improvements for vehicles and transportation (such as fleet changeout); power storage (such as flywheels and batteries, generally less than 10 megawatt equivalent); transportation management systems (such as traffic signal control systems, car navigation, speed cameras, and automatic plate number recognition); development of energy-efficient manufacturing, industrial, or building practices; and small-scale energy efficiency and conservation research and development and small-scale pilot projects. Covered actions include building renovations or new structures, provided that they occur in a previously disturbed or developed area. Covered actions could involve commercial, residential, agricultural, academic, institutional, or industrial sectors. Covered actions do not include rulemakings, standard-settings, or proposed DOE legislation, except for those actions listed in B5.1(b) of this appendix. (b) Covered actions include rulemakings that establish energy conservation standards for consumer products and industrial equipment, provided that the actions would not: (1) have the potential to cause a significant change in manufacturing infrastructure (such as construction of new manufacturing plants with considerable associated ground disturbance); (2) involve significant unresolved conflicts concerning alternative uses of available resources (such as rare or limited raw materials); (3) have the potential to result in a significant increase in the disposal of materials posing significant risks to human health and the environment (such as RCRA hazardous wastes); or (4) have the potential to cause a significant increase in energy consumption in a state or region.

#### Rational for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) provided funding to the Northwest Regional Planning Commission (NRPC) under the DOE's American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program (EECBG). NRPC proposes to sub-grant \$7,100 to the Village of Enosburg Falls, Vermont that would be used for energy efficiency retrofits at two pump houses.

The proposed project would perform weatherization activities to two pump house buildings located at 640 Reservoir Road, Berkshire, Vermont, 05450. This would consist of air sealing and insulation improvements to increase building envelope efficiency.

The proposed project would not have any adverse effects on threatened and endangered species, wetlands, floodplains, or cultural resources, as these resources are not known to occur at the proposed site. Vermont SHPO provided a determination of no adverse effect to historic properties on June 21, 2012.

Based on review of project information and the above analysis, DOE has determined that the installation of the proposed retrofits would not have a significant individual or cumulative impact to human health and/or environment. DOE has determined the proposed energy efficient lighting is consistent with the actions contained in DOE categorical exclusion B5.1 "actions to conserve energy" and is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.

Any further projects will require a separate NEPA determination review.
