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<u>Proposed Action Title</u>: (0675-1534) GE Global Research - Control Enabling Solutions with Ultrathin Strain and Temperature Sensor System for Reduced Battery Life Cycle Cost

Program or Field Office: Advanced Research Projects Agency - Energy

Location(s) (City/County/State): Niskayuna, NY; Ann Arbor, MI; Dearborn, MI

Proposed Action Description:

Funding will support efforts to develop a a novel sensor system with supporting multi-physics models to increase battery cell lifetime and extend battery range for electric vehicle applications.

Proposed work will consist of: (1) development and fabrication a novel multi-measurand sensor capable of measuring strain and temperature across multiple battery cells; (2) performance of strain and temperature testing and development and validation of multi-physics models; (3) development and optimization of a battery management system; and (4) development of a prototype battery system that will be tested in a laboratory setting and in-vehicle within private testing facilities.

Development and fabrication of the novel sensor will take place at GE Global Research's laboratory and research facilities in Niskayuna, NY. Strain and temperature testing and development of multi-physics models will take place at the University of Michigan's facilities in Ann Arbor, MI. Development of the battery management system and testing of the battery system will take place at Ford Motor Company's laboratory facilities and test track in Dearborn, MI.

There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposal has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

Based on my review of the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (as authorized under DOE Order 451.1B), I have determined that the proposed action fits within the specified class(es) of action, the other regulatory requirements set forth above are met, and the proposed action is hereby categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
