	The American Samoa government has been granted \$18.6 million to invest in territory-level energy efficiency and renewable energy priorities. Over the course of the Recovery Act, American Samoa expects to weatherize approximately 225 homes.	American Samoa was granted \$9.6 million to develop, promote, implement, and manage local energy efficiency programs.	The American Samoa government has been granted \$100,000 to offer consumer rebates for purchasing certain ENERGY STAR® appliances, which reduce energy use and save money for families, while helping the environment and supporting the local economy.
