


Campo's Renewable Energy

Campo Band of Mission Indians

- One of 12 Kumeyaay tribes
- Over 350 tribal members
- Approximately 64 miles from the City of San Diego in Eastern San Diego County, California
- Located on the U.S.-Mexico border



Kumeyaay Wind



- 50 MW Wind Project completed in 2005, online in 2006
- Electricity production of over 175 thousand megawatt hours in 2010
- Largest utility-scale wind farm operating in Indian Country



Additional Projects




- Increased opportunity created with state and federal incentives for renewable energy projects
- Transmission availability

Timeline & Key Milestones



- August 2009 – Begin installation of met towers
- December 2009 – Tribal Economic Development Bond
- October 2010 – DOE grant funds confirmed



Shu'luuk Wind Project



- Phase I
 - Up to 250 MW
 - Wind and Solar

- Phase II
 - 40 MW
 - Wind and Solar



Phase I Shu'luuk Wind



- Draft EIS Nov. 5, 2012
- Final EIS March 2012

- Alt 1 = 250 MW
- Alt 2 = 200 MW
- Alt 3 = 160 MW



Phase II Shu'luuk Wind



- Remaining capacity

Most likely scenario

- 160 MW Phase I wind only
- 40 MW Phase II wind and solar

Application for START grant approved 2012
