

Dear Department of Energy,

I am opposed to Clean Line's Project being approved. My neighbors and I have many concerns regarding Clean Line's proposed project. The home where I live for over twenty years was struck by a devastating tornado in 2009. We lost two of our neighbors as a result of the tornado. We have worked hard and placed our life savings into rebuilding the family home. Over the past 5 years a funnel cloud went directly over our home and another tornado touch down just south of the property. We have safety concerns that the likelihood of another tornado striking these massive towers which are planned on being built less than 100 meters from our home. Our town which is located in tornado alley, has one of the highest ranked areas that a tornado will strike.

Another concern is property depreciation of our property without compensation. Our farm has been in the family for years. My grandfather and uncles worked the land I now own. If Clean Line's Project is approved, my family will suffer the financial burden resulting in the loss of property value of our home and land. Since the line will not be on our land, we will receive no compensation. The majority of farmers I have spoken to are against Clean Line's Project even with compensation. Farmers do not want these massive towers to interfere with their farming practices, cause potential health problems, and destroy landscape. My Amish neighbors with large families fear the potential health risks resulting from these lines. Please deny Clean Line's Project, the benefits from this company do not outweigh the burden that would result on the people.
