The Mickey Leland Energy Fellowship (MLEF) Program provides college students with an opportunity to gain and develop research skills with the Department of Energy's Office of Fossil Energy. The program was created in 1995 with the goal of improving opportunities for under-represented students in the STEM fields. All eligible candidates are encouraged to apply.

For 10 weeks over the summer, participants will:

- Train under the mentorship of program officials and scientists to obtain valuable experience on mission-related research programs while gaining insight into how the DOE is working to meet the energy challenges of the future.
- Receive a stipend. Some participants may be eligible to receive housing and travel allowance for the duration of the program.
- Present research findings at a "Technical Forum" and tour a technical site located nearby.
